SUBJECT: Proposed Resolution requesting Reduced Speed on SR514 Malabar Road to 45mph and Traffic Signalization at Corey Road Immediately

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

In the Spring of 2016, Malabar Council communicated with residents and business owners in the area and asked their opinion of the proposals from Engineering firm doing the Preliminary Design and Engineering (PD&E) for FDOT. Most of the responses were to prioritize the improvements at Corey and Weber intersections at Malabar Road.

There was also concern that none of the proposals lessened the severity of the curve east of the Fire Department. Because of that meeting, Malabar Council drafted a resolution that requested reduced speed and traffic signals at Corey and Weber Roads in addition to their position to FDOT that the intersection improvements should be done first. The resolution that was ultimately adopted in June 2016 deleted the traffic signals and the request for reduced speed.

In August of 2016 a group of concerned citizens took petitions around the community to ask users of SR 514, Malabar Road, users to sign the petition to request FDOT reduce the speed to 45mph between Weber Road and Marie Street. Those petitions were then sent to FDOT.

The purpose of this resolution is to specifically request FDOT recognize the Home Rule Authority to regulate the speed within the jurisdiction of Malabar and reduce the traveling speed to 45 mph and install a traffic signal at the intersection of SR514 and Corey Road.

F. PUBLIC:

Laura Mahoney (Laura), 2475 Malabar Road Malabar Road. Discussed the concerns for Weber & Corey Road, Laura had spoken to Georgianna Gillet, Transportation Program Specialists for FDOT about George Fosters property, Laura thought that Fosters property was spared from being touched in the road widening on Malabar Road, but after further discussion with Ms. Gillet the analysis is not complete yet. The Weber & Corey Road project is fully funded with safety monies, it will be started 2018-2019, the actual construction 2019. Megan is the engineer doing the drawings and Laura did not talk to Megan.

Laura proposed if P&Z would work on an improvement plan to improve Corey and Weber Road, and set aside monies to improve those roads while FDOT is working on Corey & Weber Road at the same time and the Town could work with engineers and possibly get SU Funds, (extra money from the government). The Board discussed working with the state to do this work simultaneously.

Laura adds that In April, the FDOT comes out with what the road names will be categorized, for example, Valkaria Road is a "CT-2", which is a rural road and making the speed limit 35-45 mph

2. Discussion on Zoning/Land Use Change/Conditional Use in RR-65 (Mrs. Karissa Tolliver-Potential Land Owner)

Mrs. Karissa did not confirm attendance and did not attend this meeting.

Mayor Reilly, 1985 Howell Lane, cautioned the Board about any land changes would be present to future, for example, RR-65 to LC and that is the only LC in that area it would be "spot zoning". The comprehensive plan needs to be followed and along with the Land Use Ordinances. The change would need to fit in that category and to have a school in this area would not be a conditional use. Mayor suggested considering all things when reviewing these types of changes.

Sherear explained that Mrs. Tolliver had some type of Therapy School with Horses and Children in Palm Bay, and was considering moving this to Malabar, she is presently a resident in Malabar. Mrs. Tolliver was supposed to submit more information on this consideration.

3. SR 514 (Malabar Road) Widening Project (Florida Today Article 3/1/ 2017)

Ritter talked about the studies done for Malabar Road widening and the packet of information concerning the widening that Doug Hoyt, Town Administrator sent to Gov. Rick Scott and other outside agencies. Dial spoke about the 4-laning of Malabar Road. Dial said they should be thinking now about what could happen in the future.

Dial asked if the state looked at this 4-laning. Foster said he would be in favor. Ritter explained that they could not take EELs and Conservation land. Foster said he talked to Mike Knight (EEL's Representative); he said you have to go through all the different agencies. The state FDOT was not interested.

Ritter said the "Down Town" area of Malabar might move towards the Malabar Community Park & Fire Department.

Foster talked about communicating with FDOT concerning the Malabar Road study of 4-laning, his house could be in the path for the road widening. The agencies he (Foster) had contacted said they would keep him informed about the progress of the road widening. The agencies talked about saving his house, and they would have a new plan February 7, 2017.

The Board discussed the widening and the progress of Malabar Road.

CM Laura Mahoney, 2475 Malabar Road said she had called FDOT and they told Laura that they had "fully funded safety money." The FDOT told Laura that in February they had gone for a redrawing of the road widening to save Fosters house. There have been studies done in reference to the traffic flow on Malabar Road and there is not much traffic by the railroad tracks, there is more traffic by Weber Road. The traffic is heavier at Babcock Road, and it is possible they are doing 4-laning from Babcock to Weber Road. The next phase is 4-laning from Weber Road to Corey Road. There is fully Funded Safety monies, this is extra and the design should be done by 2019. It is Federal monies specifically for safety and we do qualify. This is supposed to improve the Weber & Corey Road intersections. The Towns responsibility is the turn lanes approaching Malabar Road on Corey & Weber Road.

Foster asked Laura about information concerning saving his house with the proposed 4-laning on Malabar Road. Laura said she spoke to Georgianna Gillet with FDOT, and she told Laura that FDOT would not have to "clip" his land and that they solved the problem. Foster thanked Laura for information.

Ritter said we need to look at the vision of where we would like to see the Town is going in the future, and where the Town is presently.

Foster asked about the lowering of the speed limit on Malabar Road, Sherear responded that a letter was received at the Town explaining that the current speed limit of 55 east of Weber Road is going to be reduced to "50mph" within the next 2 weeks.

Don Krieger 2345 Lineberry Lane, Malabar (representative for the TPO for the Town) he is the coordinator spokesperson. The speed limits on Malabar Road it is designated a C2 T rural by-way, it is the same as Valkaria Road (speed limit is 45mph), and if we want to keep a Rural Town we do not want the 4-laning of Malabar Road. There is no funding until 2035; nothing is going to happen for widening Malabar Road right now. Krieger explained that 75% of all road monies are taken up by buying land to develop the roads.

Krieger explained that he had created the Resolution 6-2016 creating a "No Build"; Krieger said that they are going to build something, re-pave the road, put a bike path, reinforce it, widen the road. Krieger is working with Drew Thompson (Trails & Greenways) to work on multi-modal format that are paved 12-14ft. wide pathways throughout Malabar.

Krieger's suggested to the PZ Board to stick to the Resolution of 6-2016 to work towards the future for the two intersections of Corey & Weber Road and to get "SU Funds".

CM Laura Mahoney, talked about multi-modal path paved and reinforced to take a vehicle. The major thing TPO is working on presently.

Ritter talked about eco-tourism destination.

Foster said we have three arterial roads in Malabar; we can encourage business to bring revenue to the Town to build the parks, etc. We need to be a little more flexible to businesses and more inviting.

Ritter said if you go 6 miles, you could have everything.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF MALABAR, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PPROVIDING COUNCIL DIRECTION TO THE SPACE COAST METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION AND THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REGARDING WIDENING PLANS FOR SR514 PROVIDING FOR UNIFORM DIRECTION; PROVIDING FOR ONE CONTACT REGARDING THE WIDENING PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION OF RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Malabar Road, State Road 514 that intersects the Town of Malabar from east to west approximately three miles at Township lines 28 and 29 in South Brevard County; and

WHEREAS, The Malabar Council has been aware of the Florida Department of Transportation's plans to widen SR 514 for decades and has provided multiple requests for safety improvements; and

WHEREAS, Malabar Council has also adopted resolutions supporting various proposals from Engineering Firms hired by FDOT that have varied from Malabar's original requests which may have appeared as mixed messages at the SCTPO; and

WHEREAS, Malabar Council realizes that there are now numerous impediments to the widening project proposed in 1987, such as the designated conservation lands and the extensive Florida Power and Light Company infrastructure improvements of concrete power poles on the north side of SR514, that will impact future expansion plans; and

WHEREAS, Malabar Council desires to set out clearly the SR514 roadway safety concerns voiced by Malabar residents and formalize these requests in this resolution and solicit support from surrounding communities, the Brevard Legislative Delegation and State and Federal Representatives; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN OF MALABAR OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA that;

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The above recitals are true and correct and are considered an integral part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2. The Town Council hereby requests *immediate State action* on the following Town of Malabar Concerns related to Malabar Road, SR514 roadway:

- Reduce Speed to 45 miles per hour within Malabar jurisdiction
- Install traffic light as intersection of Corey Road and Malabar Road

SECTION 3. The Town Council hereby requests **secondary State action** on the following Town of Malabar Concerns related to Malabar Road, SR514 roadway:

- Install traffic light as intersection of Weber Road and Malabar Road
- Eliminate the Roundabouts from the proposed widening plans

SECTION 4. The Town of Malabar Council realizes that additional requirements for safety have been planned for future funding in 2030-2040 but is adamant that Section 2 and Section 3 requests are imperative to the immediate safety of the traveling public and must be put in place in the interim period as early as 2019.

SECTION 5. The Town Council hereby requests consideration of the following improvements as part of the widening project in the 2025-2030 funding periods:

- Include a multimodal paved path on the north side of Malabar Road between Marie Street and the Malabar Community Park and beyond to the Palm Bay Community Hospital
- Eliminate the sidewalks on the south side of Malabar Road

SECTION 7. All resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Upon the adoption of this Resolution the Town shall direct the Clerk to forward executed copies to the surrounding communities, the Brevard Legislative Delegation, State and Federal representative and the local media.

Dear Mayor Crews:

We have completed our review your request for traffic signal control at both Corey Road and Weber Road at their intersection with State Road 514.

We have found that the installation of a traffic signal at either intersection is not justified. Of the 12-month crash data received, none were related to intersection operation, and delay was found to be minimal throughout most the day. The volume of traffic entering State Road 514 from these side streets also falls short of the volume thresholds necessary to justify a traffic signal.

We are presenting to the City of Malabar several side street improvements that are recommended. They include installing a northbound right-turn lane to reduce the (7:40-8:00) delay experienced on Weber Road and, with this project, increase the radii on the southwest corner to accommodate semi-trucks making an eastbound right turn.

As a result of this study, we also recommend the City consider installing right turn lanes on the side street approaches of Corey Road. There is a candidate project in the Department's work program for the addition of a westbound left turn lane and an eastbound right turn lane at this intersection. A copy of the conceptual design is enclosed for you.

The Department will schedule to trim the vegetation to the property lines on the mainline approaches to each intersection to improve the clear site, as you requested.

TOWN COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MARCH 21, 1989 MINUTES

This regular Town Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM in the Council chambers of the Town Hall, 2725 Malabar Rd., Malabar, Fl. with Chairperson Diana Alagood presiding. Mayor Callagy led the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

The chair opened the public portion of the meeting.

n>>Charlene Smith, Indian Coast Properties, representing property owners of the Horace C. Price subdivision questioned the Council and the attorney about ordinance pertaining to these one acre lots and the ability to obtain building permits for them. Kreuzkamp referred Ms. Smith to section 20-541 (a) and 542 of the code. Basically, non-conforming lots of record (prior to October 1979) can be developed even if they do not meet area requirements, but must meet set backs and structure size and septic placement.

Mayor Callagy introduced Mrs. Marjorie Woods, who, with neighbors presented a complaint concerning noise and late hours at Malabar Mos' take out on Malabar Road. The clerk was instructed to write to the ABC requesting an investigation by a beverage agent since the license is for carry out only.

Public comments were taken on the proposed route and widening of SR514:

- Homer Denius, 1200 Sarno Road, a Malabar property owner commented that the Land Use Plan was developed on the basis of Plan A (Malabar Road) Plan B (Township Road) was not considered during that process.
- Philip Creuss, 2510 Johnston Avenue asked if the state would still maintain Malabar Road if plan B were chosen. The reply was that DOT said it would go back to the town.
- Barbara Huggins and husband preferred alternate A.
- Mary Billie, 2715 Malabar Road prefers Plan B. She does not her home destroyed since it is over 100 years old.
- Charlene Smith, Lorayne Marshall, Connie Brooks prefer Plan B.
- Terry and Gene Brody, Dr. Richard and Katie Wecker, Jim Parker, prefer Plan A.

Mr. Ed Wenger said the Town had received a letter from DOT stating that Malabar Road east of I-95 would be 4-laned with land acquisitions starting February 1987.

Diana Alagood told the Committee that she had researched building permits issued by the Town 1981 - 1985 and the percentage of houses over 1,500 square feet was as follows:

Corey	72%
Weber	33%
Atz	67%
Hall	50%
Average	61%

In the period 1975 - 1985, 75% of the homes built in Malabar were over 1,500 square feet.

Dear Mr. Hoyt:

We have received your letter dated February 22, 2017, along with the attached report detailing the history of proposed changes to Malabar Road (SR 514). The Department shares the Town's concern for traffic safety and has no objection to modifying the road to better fit the context of the Malabar community. We have heard the Town's requests for safety, lower travel speeds, and increased capacity. We have short, mid, and long term projects already in place to address these requests.

Additionally, upon receipt of your letter, Governor Scott requested that the Department respond and work with you to responsibly address the needs of your community.

For short term efforts, we have recently completed a speed limit study and found justification to lower the existing 55 MPH speed limit to 50 MPH. We understand there is a desire to further lower the speed limit and we are open to that as conditions in the vicinity continue to develop.

For a near term project, we currently have the left turn lanes at Corey and Weber Roads in design with funding programmed for right of way acquisition next year and then construction in the 2019/20 fiscal year. This project will improve safety and specifically address the potential for rear end collisions as people slow down to make left turns.

For longer term efforts we have a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study, to widen Malabar Road, which is well underway, with completion scheduled for June 2018. With this effort we have a goal to increase efficiency and reduce delay while also reducing travel speeds and increasing safety. We are specifically pursuing enhanced safety and speed reduction by considering a system of well-spaced alternative intersection designs along Malabar Road. Our team has a meeting scheduled with you later this month to present these alternatives.

We have completed our review of the need for a traffic signal at the intersection of State Road 514 and Corey Road.

We found that a traffic signal is not justified at this time. The intersection was found to operate safely and efficiently under stop control with side street delay less than what could be expected by the installation of a traffic signal. A traffic signal at this location would increase overall intersection delay and the potential for an increase in collisions, most notably mainline rear-end crashes. Please note we currently have a left turn lane project scheduled on State Road 514 at Corey Road in the near future. We are also looking at the possibility of roundabout alternatives along the State Road 514 corridor in association with a larger widening project due to their known safety and operational benefits.

Should side street delay become problematic for the northbound Corey Road approach, consideration of a right turn lane on Corey Road by the appropriate maintaining agency could assist with improving efficiency. We also found the need to refresh the Stop Ahead pavement marking on Corey Road. By copy of this letter, we request the maintaining agency to consider making this change during routine maintenance.

Governor Scott.

Our Town is in need of your assistance accelerating the nearly 40-year-old proposed improvements to the referenced State Roadway - a brief history ensues.

- 1. 12/1986, letter from FDOT stating that Malabar Rd. east of I-95 would be 4 lane with land acquisitions starting 2/1987. This did not take place.
- 2. 2013 FDOT engaged Moffatt & Nichol to perform a study with several "what if" approaches to improving the traffic flow on SR-514. To this date a final plan has not been adopted.
- 3. 2014 FDOT engaged Atkins Engineering to perform a study and proceed with construction of two left turn lanes from SR-514 onto Corey Rd. and Weber Rd., respectively. This project is funded **but does not include turn signals**. Moreover, the proposed bid/construct/completion date is in the 2019 2022 range.
- 4. 06/2016 Malabar Town Council adopted a resolution requesting/affirming turn lanes in an effort to improve traffic flow through this Community and improve safety for the residents of Malabar, Grant-Valkeria, Palm Bay and others using this roadway.

As the population in Florida increases, the vehicle loading on SR-514 has increased as well. Concurrent with this is an increase in traffic incidents. In 2012 there were 12 incidents — while increasing to 23 incidents in 2015. This year by the end of 2016, there were 48 incidents — more than twice the amount in 2015. During the five-year period from 2012 to 2015 five fatalities occurred. The federal government (NHTSA) and AAA Auto Club both indicate that the average cost to the community at large relating to a single fatality is \$6, M (\$30M) not to mention the costs relating to the 112 non-fatal incidents during this time period.

Brevard County has experienced a 4.5% growth over the past 5 years. During this time many of the state roads have been improved to accommodate the resultant increase in traffic. SR-514 has been improved WEST of the Town Boundary, but this highway within the Town of Malabar continues to be ignored.

FDOT indicates that they have funding targeted for this project not including traffic control lights. Note: the expected cost of this entire project, even with the addition of traffic control lights, is less than the expense of one fatality.

The Town of Malabar respectfully requests immediate attention to the following:

- A. Finalized plans for the two turn lane areas (Corey & Weber) with traffic control signals.
- B. Construction to begin concurrent with the immediate acquisition of right of way, not 2019-2021.
- C. An Emergency Stop signal to be installed at the juncture of the Malabar Fire Department entrance to SR-514.
- D. Multimodal lane on the north side of SR-514

Benefits to the surrounding communities would include: reduced traffic incidents including fatalities. Safer access to and from Corey Rd. and Weber Rd. onto SR-514, improved StormWater management and Accommodation to the influx of citizens migrating to Florida.

Assistance on your part in accelerating this thirty-year-old proposed improvement to the portion of SR-514 would be greatly appreciated. The Safety of our Citizens and Visitors to our State deserve nothing less.

Malabar leaders tell FDOT to hurry up and fix Malabar Road

MALABAR — Town officials are lobbying political leaders across Florida to hurry up and widen the eastern end of Malabar Road - a project that has generated discussion for decades.

"This has been going on since 1976. It's 41 years in the making. And nothing's happened. It's been 41 years, and it's still the same road, Malabar Town Administrator Doug Hoyt said.

"They've had three or four different plans. But generally, the consensus of these meetings is, 'Well, we're going to have to go back and do some more studies.' I'm a little baffled about this," Hoyt said.

"(State Road) 514 is one of the few east-west roads in Brevard County that isn't four-laned, that doesn't have stoplights, and that doesn't

have safety measures that really are required here in

this area," he said.

Last week, Hoyt sent a 37-page packet of Malabar Road information to Gov. Rick Scott, Florida Department of Transportation administrators, state legislators, city leaders in Palm Bay and Grant-Valkaria, Brevard Public Schools Superintendent Desmond Blackburn and other officials.

Town data shows Malabar Road crashes increased from 12 in 2012 to 48 last year. During that five-year span, the town reported a total of 73 non-injury crashes, 38 injury crashes and five fatalities on Malabar Road.

• Stoplights and turn lanes at the intersections of We-

ber and Corey roads.

Lowering the speed limit from 55 mph to 45 mph from Babcock Street to U.S. 1.

· An emergency stop signal at the Malabar Fire Department to help speed up response times.

 A paved multi-use trail for walkers and bicyclists along the north side of Malabar Road.

In the meantime, FDOT engineers continue studying a future project that could widen Malabar Road from two to four lanes between Babcock Street and U.S. 1.

A development-environmental study started in 2013, was paused in 2015, and restarted in 2016, said Steve Ol-

son, FDOT spokesman.

"A unique challenge is fitting a four-lane roadway between locations with a wildlife sanctuary and a public park on opposite sides of the roadway, while also being mindful of impacts to private landowners. A design alternative that takes all factors into consideration will be presented at a public hearing during the second half of this year," Olson said.

FDOT anticipates completing the development-environmental study in March 2018, and design work will begin in April 2020, Olson said. No construction date has

been scheduled.

On a smaller scale, FDOT is working on a \$1.8 million Malabar Road project designed to upgrade the Weber and Corey road intersections. Plans call for turn lanes, milling and resurfacing, guardrail upgrades, drainage improvements, signage and pavement marking.

Construction is funded for 2019, Olson said.

"Both projects are following specific schedules and specific steps — that are part of the process, to bring a project from concept to completion, "Olson said.

Hoyt's 37-page packet included Malabar Town Hall historical research on widening Malabar Road:

1976: In Malabar's comprehensive land-use plan, town officials stated that Malabar Road should be enlarged to four lanes after 1995.

1986: FDOT sent Malabar officials a letter stating that Malabar Road would be widened east of I-95, with land acquisitions starting in 1987.

1989: The Greater South Brevard Area Chamber of Commerce endorsed the widening of Malabar Road as soon as possible, contending that traffic congestion impeded commercial interests.

1989: A FDOT engineering report determined that Malabar Road warranted widening east of Babcock Street soon after 1993.

2014: A FDOT newsletter stated that intersection safety upgrades at Corey and Weber roads were funded for design, right-of-way acquisition and construction.

"Every year that improvements to SR-514 are delayed continues to put drivers at risk and the cost of these improvements continues to escalate. Another 'study' is not required, in the writer's opinion. The State needs to move ahead NOW with the long promised upgrades and safety to this road through our Town," Hoyt wrote in his presentation.

In a letter to Malabar residents posted Monday on the Town Hall website, Hoyt estimated that Malabar residents have bought at least 46 million gallons of gasoline and paid at least \$9 million in gas taxes since 1976.

FDOT engineers discussed the Corey-Weber intersection project during an open house last July at Palm Bay Hospital.

Town councilwoman Marisa Acquaviva is concerned that the plan doesn't call for lowering the current 55 mph speed limit on the road, which had a daily average of more than 12,000 vehicles last year.

"I'm very excited we are going to get our road improved, but at the same time a lot of the residents have spoken up about lowering the speed and adding a traffic light at Corey and Malabar roads." Acquaviva said.

She worries that a wider road will make it even more difficult for motorists to negotiate the intersection. The three-term

councilwoman frequently uses the Corey Road intersection and has had three Road and contends the family members involved in accidents there.

"That is a very tough road to come out on Malabar Road," Acquaviva said.

Traffic accidents have become a commonplace near First Baptist Church of Malabar, which is on the southeast corner of the intersection of Corey and Malabar roads, according to Kenneth Bukowski, office manager for church.

"It's dangerous and especially for the church," Bukowski said. "Every time we turn around there is an accident."

He also suggests a traffic light at Corey Road could make the road safer. "It's very difficult to

pull out of Corey Road," Bukowski said. "That is really where most of our accidents take place."


Councilman Dick Korn also advocates lowering the speed on Malabar current 55 mph speed limit is unsafe for the amount of residential and business access points along the road.


"The speed limit is out of character with the rest of the county," Korn said.

Malabar's wider road plan drives speed issue

Town officials say intersection already unsafe at 55 mph limit

Transportation planners want to widen a state road through Malabar, but town leaders say the options don't go far enough to make Malabar Road safe.

The Florida Department of Transportation will present alternatives for three sections of Malabar Road from Babcock Street to U.S. 1 at a public meeting Tuesday.

The plans would convert the two-lane road to a four-lane divided roadway, except through the area near U.S. 1, which would be expanded to three lanes with the center lane for turning. Sidewalks and bike paths would be added to the entire 3.6-mile project.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

Last year in the Spring, Malabar Council communicated with residents and business owners in the area and asked their opinion of the proposals from Engineering firm doing the Preliminary Design and Engineering (PD&E) for FDOT. The majority of the responses were to prioritize the improvements at Corey and Weber intersections at Malabar Road. There was also concern that none of the proposals lessened the severity of the curve east of the Fire Department. As a result of that meeting, Malabar Council drafted a resolution that requested reduced speed and traffic signals at Corey and Weber Roads in addition to their position to FDOT that the intersection improvements should be done first. The resolution that was ultimately adopted in June 2016 deleted the traffic signals and the request for reduced speed.

In August of 2016 a group of concerned citizens took petitions around the community to ask users of SR 514, Malabar Road, users to sign the petition to request FDOT reduce the speed to 45mph between Weber Road and Marie Street. Those petitions were then sent to FDOT.

As shown in the package the TA assembled for the Governor and other interested agencies, these have not been recent requests but rather a continual repeated request for assistance.

The purpose of this resolution is to specifically state the need for a 45mph zone, traffic signals at Corey and Weber and consideration of the severe curve and potential harm if not lessoned; and the need for a multimodal paved path on the NORTH side of SR514 Malabar Road so that we can seek support from our neighbors in Grant-Valkaria, Palm Bay and the County.



A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF MALABAR, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, REQUESTING A REDUCTION OF SPEED ON STATE ROAD 514 ALSO KNOWN AS MALABAR ROAD FROM THE WEST END OF THE JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARY EAST TO MARIE STREET; REQUESTING EXPEDITED INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT COREY AND WEBER ROADS TO INCLUDE TRAFFIC SIGNALS; SOLICITING SUPPORT FROM OTHER COMMUNITIES AND AGENCIES IN THIS REQUEST TO FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION OF REQUEST; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, SR 514 Malabar Road is a State Road that intersects the Town of Malabar from Highway 1 westward to the Town limits; and,

WHEREAS, SR 514 Malabar Road from US Highway 1 to Babcock Street (in Palm Bay) is approximately three and a half miles of which three miles is within the jurisdiction of the Town of Malabar; and,

WHEREAS, SR 514 Malabar Road is used as a major collector and evacuation route and is used anytime there is an incident on I-95 requiring alternative routing; and

WHEREAS, SR 514 Malabar Road will require unique design in the widening in order to avoid negative effects on future commercial growth and the active disc golf course; and

WHEREAS, Such design must include reducing the speed to 45 mph between Marie Street west to the Town boundary; reducing the severity of curve as well as incorporating a multimodal paved path on the north side of SR 514; and

WHEREAS, FDOT has acknowledged since the 1980's the need to widen and improve SR 514, Malabar Road, within Malabar jurisdiction and the Town has requested assistance from FDOT in writing since 2004 expressing a need for reduced speed and traffic signals and the Town is on record for requesting expedited priority for the intersection improvements at Corey and Weber Roads in order to improve traffic flow and alleviate current dangerous conditions.
