Current Event Status

Event Overview

- The pandemic currently affects over 185 countries, with more than 1,961,965 cases worldwide, including 594,207 cases in the United States
- Residents may call 2-1-1 for up-to-date information between 8 AM and 6 PM daily
- The FDOH COVID-19 call
 center is available 7 days a week, 24 hours a day at 1-866-779-6121, but is experiencing a
 large volume of calls. Another option is to email COVID-19@flhealth.gov



- There are 163 confirmed COVID-19 cases, and 6 deaths in Brevard County.
- Florida Dept of Health:
 - Now offering free tests only for Priority 2: patients in long-term care with symptoms, those 65 or older with symptoms, those with underlying conditions and symptoms, and first responders with symptoms
- Brevard County Libraries have provided unemployment applications and tax forms
 outside every library 24 hours a day. In addition, the Cathy Schweinsberg Rood Central
 Library, the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Library, the Franklin T. DeGroodt Library, the
 Melbourne Beach Library, the Melbourne Library, the Mims/Scottsmoor Library, the Port
 St. John Library, the South Mainland Library, the Suntree/Viera Library, the Titusville
 Library, and the West Melbourne Library all have a table of free books available outside
 the library from 9 AM to 4:45 PM Monday through Friday.
- The Board of County Commissioners adopted a proclamation requesting businesses implement CDC social distancing recommendations by making these standards part of their day-to-day operations:



- All employees and patrons should practice social distancing by staying at least six feet apart;
- Group meetings, trainings, and other gatherings are to be limited to 10 persons of less;
- Occupancy should be limited to no more than 30 percent of the maximum allowable capacity under the fire code for non-residential, non-medical, and non-lodging uses;
- Business should install appropriate signage, floor markings, or such other means as may be necessary to remind customers and employees of the importance of social distancing at entry and exit points, checkout points, staging areas, etc.
- Brevard County Public Schools served over 43,000 meals at 27 food distribution sites. Click for locations.
- ESF18 Business & Industry:
 - A call to businesses in Brevard County, looking for Personal Protection Equipment to be donated for use by hospitals and emergency workers. PPE includes
 - Gloves: Must be non-latex for medical use, can be made of nitrile or vinyl, any color, any size except small or extra small, unopened boxes please
 - Masks: Disposable surgical or procedure masks with ties or elastic, any color;
 N95 or KN95 masks any size/manufacturer; *Will also accept home-sewn masks as well for distribution to ALF/nursing home residents
 - Goggles or face protection: Clear, either goggles with straps, or eyeglass type; face shields that cover masks—clear thin plastic
 - Gowns: Yellow isolation, non-woven lightweight fabric-disposable; blue barrier, thin blue plastic disposable; will also accept Tyvek bunny suits
 - Miscellaneous supplies: hand sanitizer unopened bottles of any size, fragrance, brand; shoe covers; hair covers; thermometers - electronic oral or any other type; probe covers for thermometers
 - If you have PPE you are willing to donate, please ship to warehouse location: 560
 Solutions Way, Rockledge, FL.
 - Please note, we are only looking for PPE from businesses. Individuals who may have items to donate should give to United Way, Meals on Wheels or similar organizations.
- CareerSource Brevard:
 - Reemployment Assistance Announcement -- Paper applications are now available online at the state's improved Reemployment Assistance resource page: www.Floridajobsresources.com
- Brevard County Utility Services:
 - (Not COVID-related) North Brevard/Mims area residents should reduce water usage for non-essential activities, such as washing cars and watering grass until further notice.
- Brevard County issued an order to limit tourism and lodging, and to prohibit usage of spoil islands:
 - Brevard County is closed to tourists and leisure visitors.

- Effective April 3, all hotels, motels, campgrounds, short-term (less than 28 days)
 vacation rentals, and other transient rentals, to include marinas, recreational vehicle parks, and timeshares, shall cease renting to tourists for 30 days.
- The order does not apply to rentals to transitory military personnel, first responders, healthcare workers, construction workers actively engaged in projects in Brevard County, and others working or engaged in formal business in Brevard County.
- All access and use of spoil islands and sandbars are prohibited.
- (Not COVID-related) A burn ban is in effect countywide due to the Keetch-Byram Drought Index exceeding 500. All of east central Florida now in moderate drought conditions.
- Space Coast Area Transit has waived fares through April 30. Bus routes are now available between 7 AM and 6 PM.
- Eastern Florida State College:
 - All four EFSC campuses remain closed for the rest of the spring term.
 - Student Services are available remotely, including virtual one-on-one student meetings that may be necessary. View our Student Services guide for details.

Town of Indialantic

- Beaches are closed to all activities except walking, jogging, biking, fishing, surfing, and swimming through April 30. Activities such as sunbathing, sitting in chairs, organized sports, or lying on blankets and grouping of persons is not permitted.
 People will not be allowed to congregate on boardwalks and access areas.
 Compliance with the CDC recommendations regarding social distancing shall apply.
- Beach parking and beach access parking will remain closed.
- Town Hall, police, and fire departments remain closed to the public. Customer service continues by telephone or electronically.
- City of Indian Harbour Beach:
 - All beach parking is restricted.

 - Building Department permit pick-up, issuance, and payment is by appointment only.
 Plan review will continue as normal.
- City of Satellite Beach:
 - Satellite Beaches are closed to all activities except walking, jogging, biking, fishing, surfing, and swimming, through April 30. No congregating on boardwalks or accesses will be permitted.
- City of West Melbourne
 - City services are available via telephone, (321)727-7700, website, <u>www.westmelbourne.org</u> or email, <u>info@westmelbourne.org</u>. The scheduled City Council meeting of April 21 will be convened meeting all social distancing requirements. - Melbourne Beach will not be starting ID enforcement on May 2.
- Hotels remain open but closed to tourists. Exceptions include business travelers who can
 produce a note from their employer, those who are working in Brevard County, local
 residents who need to isolate away from a family member with coronavirus.
- Brevard County is not a refuge for COVID-19 positive individuals from other areas.

State/National Highlights

- Florida Department of Children and Families: announced Tallassee will pilot a program for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients to purchase groceries online with the use of an EBT card this week, and it will go statewide April 21. SNAP participants are automatically eligible to participate in this program and do not need to apply. - FEMA: Certain private non-profit (PNP) organizations are eligible to apply for funding through FEMA's Public Assistance program. For eligibility and additional information, visit the following: FEMA Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide
- The Governor's Executive Order 20-87: All vacation rentals, rental of any house, condominium, cooperative, or dwelling unit that is also a transient public lodging establishment are prohibited from making new reservations or bookings and shall not accept new guests for check-in; has been extended until April 30, per EO 20-103.
- The CDC advises that critical infrastructure workers may be permitted to continue work
 following potential exposure to COVID-19, provided they remain asymptomatic and
 additional precautions are implemented to protect them and the community, such as
 wearing a mask for 14 days, cleaning and disinfecting all surfaces, staying 6 feet away from
 anyone, and having their temperature taken daily.

- Governor DeSantis waived the work search and work registration requirements for
 individuals requesting Reemployment Assistance benefits. Individuals filing an application in
 CONNECT, the online Reemployment Assistance application, for benefits from March 15
 until May 2, will not be required to complete the work registration in Employ Florida. For

Public Protective Measures

- Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol
- Avoid close contact with sick people, and stay home when sick

- Allow telework or administrative leave
- Follow respiratory etiquette by coughing/sneezing into your sleeve
