## Current Event Status

### Event Overview

- The pandemic currently affects over 185 countries, with more than 2,394,291 cases worldwide, including 755,533 cases in the United States
- Residents may call 2-1-1 for up-to-date information between 8 AM and 6 PM daily
- The FDOH COVID-19 call center is available 7 days a week, 24 hours a day at 1-866-779-6121, but is experiencing a large volume of calls. Another option is to email [COVID-19@flhealth.gov](mailto:COVID-19@flhealth.gov)



## Local Considerations

- There are 215 confirmed COVID-19 cases, and 7 deaths in Brevard County.
- Brevard County rated a “D+” for a social distancing score today. The scoring system uses anonymized cell phone tracking data to determine how much people are leaving home for non-essential purposes. Technology and data company UnaCast has been tracking how well counties and states across the country have been following coronavirus restrictions.

- Governor DeSantis has announced that public schools will remain closed; distance learning will continue for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year.
- Health First is offering drive-up testing for first responders; call 321-434-3131 for appointment. Must show identification and credentials.
- Brevard County Parks & Recreation: All playgrounds are closed until further notice. Parks and trails remain open.

- Florida Dept of Health: Now offering free COVID-19 testing for Priority 2: patients in long-term care with symptoms, those 65 or older with symptoms, those with underlying conditions and symptoms, and first responders with symptoms
- The Board of County Commissioners adopted a proclamation requesting businesses implement CDC social distancing recommendations by making these standards part of their day-to-day operations:
  - All employees and patrons should practice social distancing by staying at least six feet apart;
  - Group meetings, trainings, and other gatherings are to be limited to 10 persons or less;
  - Occupancy should be limited to no more than 30 percent of the maximum allowable capacity under the fire code for non-residential, non-medical, and non-lodging uses;
  - Business should install appropriate signage, floor markings, or such other means as may be necessary to remind customers and employees of the importance of social distancing at entry and exit points, checkout points, staging areas, etc.
- Brevard County issued an amendment to its order to limit tourism and lodging, and to prohibit usage of spoil islands:
  - A self-certification form was approved by the BOCC and Policy Group on April 16, enabling domestic violence survivors and others with a legitimate need to shelter in Brevard County lodging to do so for medical, personal, or business purposes.
  - All access and use of spoil islands and sandbars are prohibited
- Brevard County Public Schools continues to offer meals for students are free or reduced lunch at 27 food distribution sites. Click for [locations](#)

- Brevard County Utility Services:
  - (Not COVID-related) North Brevard/Mims area residents should reduce water usage for non-essential activities, such as washing cars and watering grass, until further notice
- (Not COVID-related) A burn ban is in effect countywide due to the Keetch-Byram Drought Index exceeding 500. All of east central Florida now in moderate drought conditions.
- Space Coast Area Transit has waived fares through April 30. Bus routes are now available between 7 AM and 6 PM.
- Eastern Florida State College:
  - All four EFSC campuses remain closed for the rest of the spring term
  - Student Services are available remotely, including virtual one-on-one student meetings that may be necessary. [View our Student Services guide for details.](#)

- Supervisor of Elections:
  - Qualifying for judicial candidates begins noon Monday, April 20 through noon Friday, April 24. Although Supervisor of Elections offices are closed to the public, qualifying

paperwork can be dropped off at the Viera office utilizing the drop box in front, or call 321-633-2166 to make an appointment.

- City of Cape Canaveral:

  - Beaches are closed to all activities except walking, jogging, biking, fishing, surfing, and swimming through April 30. Activities such as sunbathing, sitting in chairs, organized sports, or lying on blankets and grouping of persons is not permitted. People will not be allowed to congregate on boardwalks and access areas. Compliance with the CDC recommendations regarding social distancing shall apply
  - Beach parking and beach access parking will remain closed.
  - Town Hall, police, and fire departments remain closed to the public. Customer service continues by telephone or electronically.
- City of Indian Harbour Beach:
  - All beach parking is restricted.

#### **Rumor Control**

- Department of Health does not send text messages telling people they need to be tested for COVID-19.
- The IRS will not call to request any personal or financial information for you to receive an economic impact payment.
- Melbourne Beach will not be starting ID enforcement on May 2.

- Hotels remain open but closed to tourists. Exceptions include business travelers, those who are working in Brevard County, and local residents who self-certify they are staying there for certain business, personal, or medical purposes.
- Microwaving face respirators is not recommended as a cleaning method. Face masks may catch fire if microwaved.

### Central Florida Highlights

- The regional testing site at the Orange County Convention Center will administer up to 750 tests per day to individuals with respiratory symptoms or preexisting conditions, regardless of age. It is free of charge and no appointment is necessary.

### **Public Protective Measures**
