Local Considerations

- There are 218 confirmed COVID-19 cases, and 7 deaths in Brevard County.
- Brevard County rated with a "D+" grade for today's social distancing score from Unacast.

- Health First is offering drive-up testing for first responders; call 321-434-3131 for appointment. Must show identification and credentials.
- Brevard County Parks & Recreation: All playgrounds are closed until further notice. Parks and trails remain open.
- Florida Dept of Health: Now offering free COVID-19 testing for Priority 2: patients in longterm care with symptoms, those 65 or older with symptoms, those with underlying conditions and symptoms, and first responders with symptoms
- The Board of County Commissioners adopted a proclamation requesting businesses implement CDC social distancing recommendations.

Community Report

- Brevard County issued an amendment to its order to limit tourism and lodging, and to prohibit usage of spoil islands:
 - A self-certification form was approved by the BOCC and Policy Group on April 16, enabling domestic violence survivors and others with a legitimate need to shelter in Brevard County lodging to do so for medical, personal, or business purposes.
 - All access and use of spoil islands and sandbars are prohibited
- Brevard County Public Schools continues to offer meals for students are free or reduced lunch at 27 food distribution sites. Click for <u>locations</u>

- Brevard County Utility Services:
 - (Not COVID-related) North Brevard/Mims area residents should reduce water usage for non-essential activities, such as washing cars and watering grass, until further notice
- (Not COVID-related) A burn ban is in effect countywide due to the Keetch-Byram Drought Index exceeding 500. All of east central Florida now in moderate drought conditions.
- Space Coast Area Transit has waived fares through April 30. Bus routes are now available between 7 AM and 6 PM.


- Town of Palm Shores

Rumor Control

- Department of Health does not send text messages telling people they need to be tested for COVID-19.
- Stimulus check recipients do not have to confirm acceptance via text message.
- Financial departments do not send text messages for financial assistance.
- The IRS will not call to request any personal or financial information for you to receive an economic impact payment.
- Antibody testing does not signify complete immunity or that there is no longer a need to social distance.

Central Florida Highlights

- The regional testing site at the Orange County Convention Center will administer up to 750 tests per day to individuals with respiratory symptoms or preexisting conditions, regardless of age. It is free of charge and no appointment is necessary.

• Florida Department of Education's Office of Early Learning has prioritized and increased access to child care services for first responders and health care professionals. First responders and health care workers needing help finding a child care provider should contact their local early learning coalition for assistance. - Governor DeSantis has announced that public schools will remain closed; distance learning will continue for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year.
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program initiative to purchase groceries online with the use of an EBT card will go statewide April 21. For more information, click <u>here</u>
- The CDC has <u>recommended</u> the use of cloth face coverings
- Executive Order 20-91: Answers to frequently asked questions relating to Governor DeSantis' Executive Order 20-91 are available <u>here</u>
- The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services issued new guidance to nursing homes requiring them to report COVID-19 cases/deaths directly to the CDC and inform residents and their families when cases occur within their facilities.
- President Trump announced plans to use the Defense Production Act to help with the production of swabs needed for COVID-19 testing. The President stated that two plants will produce 20 million swabs per month.
- The CDC <u>published</u> new forecasts of COVID-19 deaths at national and state levels, drawing from models from Los Alamos National Lab, IHME, and Columbia University based on different ranges of social distancing.

Public Protective Measures

- Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol
- Avoid close contact with sick people, and stay home when sick
- Wear a cloth face covering when in settings where social distancing is difficult to maintain
- Advise sick employees to stay home and allow telework or administrative leave
- Follow respiratory etiquette by coughing/sneezing into your sleeve
