



Brevard County

- The Board of County Commissioners approved the use of up to \$4.4 million in CARES funds for housing rental and mortgage assistance, housing utility and security deposit, and food stability for individuals impacted by COVID-19.
- The Board of County Commissioners approved partnering with the Florida Division of Emergency Management for the establishment of a State-operated drive-thru testing site in Palm Bay, as well as pursuing community testing sites in north, central and beachside locations.
- Brevard County Beaches are open, excluding the area between Patrick Air Force Base south to Spessard Hollard Park due to multiple beach renourishment project. This section will reopen on May 7.
- County Libraries will begin opening in phases and in compliance with the Governor's 25% capacity recommendation and CDC recommendations for social distancing and sanitization.

Satellite Beach	 All beach activities are permitted, but in groups of 5 or less. No congregating on boardwalks or beach access areas is permitted. 						
Titusville	 City Hall is accepting entry by appointment only and guests are required to wear a mask, respond to five health questions and have their temperature checked. On May 18, City Hall will reopen to the public. 						
West Melbourne	 West Melbourne City Hall, the Police Department lobby, the Public Works office, and the Recreation Office in the Veterans Memorial Community Center Complex are now open to the general public, although citizens are encouraged to continue to access City services primarily through telephone (321-727-7700), e-mail at info@westmelbourne.org. - AHCA to issue an emergency rule requiring hospitals to test all individuals that will be discharged to a long-term care facility, regardless of whether the individual is symptomatic.
