RESTAURANTS & FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

- ✓ May increase indoor capacity to 50% with proper social distancing
- ✓ Outdoor seating encouraged

RETAIL

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity indoors

MUSEUMS & LIBRARIES

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity if permitted by local governments

GYMS & FITNESS CENTERS

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity
- ✓ Self-sanitize machines and surfaces after use

AMUSEMENT PARKS

- ✓ May submit re-opening plan to the State

PROFESSIONAL SPORTS VENUES

- ✓ Professional sports teams are welcome in Florida
- ✓ Professional sports venues may open and operate for games, events and training

VACATION RENTALS

- ✓ Counties may seek approval to operate vacation rentals by submitting a written request and county vacation rental safety plan to the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation

ELECTIVE SURGERIES

- ✓ Elective surgeries may continue if a facility has adequate PPE, hospital bed surge capacity and works with the local community to prevent and/or contain outbreaks in long-term care facilities

BARBER SHOPS & SALONS

- ✓ Barber shops, hair salons and nail salons may operate while adhering to safety protocols effective May 11

SCHOOLS

- ✓ Students continue with distance learning

LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES

- ✓ Visitation in long-term facilities prohibited for COVID-19
- ✓ Hospitals required to test all individuals before discharge to long-term care facilities
- ✓ Long-term care facilities required to transfer COVID-19 positive residents if the facility is not equipped for appropriate care

PLAN FOR FLORIDA'S RECOVERY

Brevard County Reopening Updates

- **Vacation Rentals:**
 - County plan has been approved by the state
 - Residents from hot spots: New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Louisiana are required to stay in 14-day self-isolation
- **Amusement Parks:**
 - Each venue requires location specific plan
 - Plan needs city mayor endorsement, county manager endorsement prior to submittal to state for approval
- **Risk Levels in Public Places, consider the following:**
 - Time (amount spent in a location)
 - Space (how close you are to other people)
 - People (fewer is better than more)
 - Place (outdoors is better than indoors)

Community Feeding Operations:

- For information on food pantry locations and how to access help, utilize the United Way of Brevard's COVID-19 Community Resource guide by clicking [here](#). It is recommended that you call ahead to verify availability.
- To date, Brevard County VOAD feeding operation has delivered to pop-up food pantries at 15 churches, and the Boys and Girls Club of Cocoa. Totals from 05/14 - 05/26 (all numbers approximate):
 - Cars = 2,659
 - Walk-ups = 19
 - Families = 2,537 (not all centers collected this information)
 - Other organizations serviced by centers = 12
- Brevard County Public Schools continues to offer meals for all children up to 18 years old. Although school ends on Thursday, May 28, they will continue to provide meals for the entire week. They will then transition to 15 food distribution sites, June 1 – June 30. The sites are listed [here](#).

Titusville	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> City Hall is now open to the public with hours of operations from 9 AM to Noon, and 1 PM to 4 PM. Extra precautions are being taken during the reopening including issuing antibacterial/antimicrobial washable masks to all employees, physical distancing measures, and extra disinfecting cleaning of high traffic areas and touch points.
West Melbourne	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> City recreation programs, classes, and facility reservations are being taken for activities in July. Although the park is open, the Space Coast Field of Dreams ball fields and playground, the splash pad, and the skate park within West Melbourne Community Park remain closed. The skate park will re-open second, upon Phase 2 and after ordered repair parts arrive and repairs are made. Field of Dreams will open third. This will be upon Phase 2, after field repairs are made, and after new operating procedures are put in place.

State/National Updates

- President Trump signed a proclamation on May 24 and amended on May 25 suspending the entry into the U.S. of any foreign nationals who were present in Brazil during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States. This travel restriction applies to flights departing after 11:59 pm Eastern Daylight Time on May 26.

- Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-131, which extends E.O. 20-123, Full Phase I: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery with the following amendment:
 - Organized youth activities may operate, including youth sports teams and leagues, youth clubs and programs, and child care. Summer camps and youth recreation camps may operate including, but not limited to, those defined in 409.175 and 513.02, F.S
