## **CDC Guidance on Holidays and Small Gatherings**



If you are having a Small Gatherings for Family and Friends considered the following CDC recommendations:

- Celebrate virtually or only with members of your own household
- Attendees follow safety measures such as mask coverings, social distancing, and handwashing
- Host outdoor rather than indoor gatherings as much as possible
  - Even outdoors, require guests to wear masks when not eating or drinking
- Limit contact with commonly touched surfaces or shared items such as serving utensils
- Plan ahead and ask guests to avoid contact with people outside of their households for 14 days before the gathering



#### **Brevard County:**

- Rental/Mortgage Assistance Program and Utility/Security Deposit Program are available for applicants who submit all required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance as listed on the <u>Housing & Human</u> <u>Services Coronavirus Assistance</u> <u>Program Application Form.</u>
- Visit the Brevard CARES website for details on the <u>Small Business and</u> <u>Nonprofit Organizations grant on-line</u> <u>application</u>.
  - Small businesses and nonprofit organizations may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000 to offset expenses and lost revenue related to impacts from COVID-19.
- <u>Residents financially impacted by</u> <u>COVID-19 can apply for the A/C,</u> <u>Heating Unit Replacement Funds.</u>
  - <u>Paper applications are</u> <u>available</u> at county libraries and community Centers.
- Workforce Recovery Assistance
   <u>Program</u> applications are accepted through November 20, 2020. The program is available through
   December 30, 2020, and aids small businesses (fewer than 50 employees) impacted by COVID-19.

- <u>CDC Guidance on Thanksgiving and COVID-19</u>. If having guests to your home, be sure that people follow the steps that everyone can take to make Thanksgiving safer. Other steps you can take include:
  - Have a small outdoor meal with family and friends who live in your community.
  - Limit the number of guests.
  - Have conversations with guests ahead of time to set expectations for celebrating together.
  - Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces and items between use.
  - Limit the number of people in food preparation areas.
  - Have guests bring their own food and drink.
  - If sharing food, have one person serve food and use single-use options, like plastic utensils
