

According to the CDC, COVID-19 cases are rising, and provides the following information to slow the spread:.

Three Important Ways to Slow the Spread:

- Wear a <u>mask</u> to protect yourself and others and stop the spread of COVID-19.
- <u>Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths)</u> from others who don't live with you.
- Avoid crowds. The more people you are in contact with, the more likely you are to be exposed to COVID-19.

Vaccine Key Points

- Moderna COVID-19 vaccinations distribution started on Monday, January 4, 2021 for individuals 65 plus and health care workers with direct patient contact and who aren't affiliated with a hospital system
 - At this time, all appointments have been filled. There is no wait list and walk-ups are not accepted
 - As additional vaccine doses are received, more appointments will be made available
 - Everyone's patience is appreciated
- Individuals receiving a vaccine are required to bring:
 - <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Screening and Consent Form</u>
 - Identification form (driver's license, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
 - Vaccine appointment ticket (only applicable to those who made their appointments via the on-line registration)
 - A Doctor's consent letter is required for those who
 - Dose quantity/accessibility will determine appointment availability. New appointments will be released as additional vaccines are confirmed.
- New vaccine appointment notifications will be issued by press release, social media, and via alerts that you can receive on your mobile phone from the AlertBrevard.
 - To register for text alerts, simply create a new text message on your mobile phone to **888777** and in the text message body write **BrevardEOC** and hit send.

8 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE U.S. COVID-19 VACCINE PROGRAM

- 1. The safety of COVID vaccines is a top priority
- 2. COVID-19 vaccination will help protect you from getting COVID-19. Two doses are needed for the vaccines that are currently available.
- 3. Right now, CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines be offered to healthcare personnel and residents of long-term care facilities.
- 4. There is currently limited supply of COVID-19 vaccine in the U.S., but supply will increase in the weeks and months to come.
- 5. After COVID-19 vaccination, you may have some side effects. This is a normal sign that your body is building protection.
- 6. Cost is not an obstacle to getting vaccinated against COVID-19.
- 7. The first COVID-19 vaccine is being used under an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).
- 8. COVID-19 vaccines are one of many important tools to help us stop this pandemic.
