## Florida Phase 1 Priorities (Revised 12/23 per Executive Order 20-315)

Long-Term Care Facility residents and staff

Persons 65 years of age and older

Health care personnel with direct patient contact

### Vaccine Key Points

- Since the beginning of vaccination distribution on Monday, January 4, 2021; Department of Health-Brevard, and its partners has provided 7,200 vaccines to seniors (65 plus) and health care personnel with direct patient
- At this time, all appointments have been filled. There is no wait list and walk-ups are not accepted
  - As additional vaccine doses are received, more appointments will be made available
  - Everyone's patience is appreciated
- Individuals receiving a vaccine are required to bring:
  - [COVID-19 Vaccine Screening and Consent Form](#)
  - Identification form (driver's license, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
  - Vaccine appointment ticket (only applicable to those who made their appointments via the on-line registration)
  - Dose quantity/accessibility will determine appointment availability. New appointments will be released as additional vaccines are confirmed.
- New vaccine appointment notifications will be issued by press release, social media, and via alerts that you can receive on your mobile phone from the AlertBrevard.
  - To register for text alerts, simply create a new text message on your mobile phone to **888777** and in the text message body write **BrevardEOC** and hit send

# Brevard County COVID-19 Testing Sites (no symptoms required)



EFSC Palm Bay Campus  
(State Operated Site)

- Drive-through, no appointment required
- Monday – Sunday, 9 AM to 5 PM
- 250 Community College Parkway. (Use the entrance from San Filippo Dr. SE & Jupiter Blvd.)
- Testing available for adults and children of all ages
- Rapid antigen tests with results in as soon as 15 minutes now available
- Insurance information will be requested but is not required to receive a test
  - There will be no copay or any fee charged
- Identification is no longer required but does expedite the process

Health First

- Appointment required, call 321-434-3131
- Monday – Saturday, 9 AM to 12 PM
- Pro-Health & Fitness, 255 Borman Drive, Merritt Island

Parrish

- Appointment required for locations, call 321-268-6139 or text “covid test” to 321-204-1699.
- Locations are rotated throughout the week
  - Tuesday, 1:30 to 3:30 PM, at the Parrish Health and Fitness Center parking lot, 2210 Cheney Hwy, Titusville
  - Wednesday, 12 PM to 3 PM, at the Greater St. James Missionary Baptist Church, grass lot south of church, 2396 Harry T. Moore Ave. Mims
  - Thursday, 12 PM to 1 PM, at the Harry T. Moore Social Services Center parking lot, 725 S. Deleon Ave. Titusville
  - Friday, 9 AM to 12 PM, at the Parrish Medical Offices parking lot, 7075 US 1 Port St. John
  - Saturday, 9AM to 11 AM, at the Gibson Youth Center parking lot, 835 Sycamore St. Titusville

## WHEN VACCINE IS LIMITED, WHO GETS VACCINATED FIRST?

- Because the supply of COVID-19 vaccine in the U.S. is limited at first, CDC recommends that initial supplies of COVID-19 vaccine be allocated to healthcare personnel and long-term care facility residents.
- This recommendation was made on December 3, 2020, and based it on recommendations from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), an independent panel of medical and public health experts.
- The recommendations were made with these goals in mind:
  - Decrease death and serious disease as much as possible
  - Preserve functioning of society
  - Reduce the extra burden COVID-19 is having on people already facing disparities
- As vaccine availability increases, vaccination recommendations will expand to include more groups

### Do masks help slow the spread of COVID-19?

\*Kansas counties that adopted mask mandates saw a 6% decrease in COVID-19 cases. Counties that didn't saw a 100% increase. [Trends in County-Level COVID-19 Incidence in Counties With and Without a Mask Mandate — Kansas, June 1-August 23, 2020].

In Kansas, counties that opted to have people wear masks slowed the spread of COVID-19.
