Improving Mask Effectiveness

A mask worn incorrectly is not safe

How to properly wear and use a mask

DO



Wash your hands with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer before you **put on, touch, or take off** your mask.



Use the ties or loops to put your mask on and take it off.



Cover your mouth, nose bridge, and chin.

DON'T



Touch your mask or face without first using soap and water for 20 seconds, or alcohol-based hand sanitizer until hands are dry.



Pull the front of the mask up or down to **talk, breathe, or eat**—assume the front is contaminated.

[The CDC recommends wearing masks when around other people, and masks are required on public transportation.](#) Wearing a cloth mask with multiple layers of fabric or wearing two masks (wearing a “double mask”) reduces the risk of transmitting COVID-19 by improving mask fit and filtration.

A recent [study](#) found that a “double mask” provided much better protection compared with a cloth mask by itself or a medical procedure mask by itself.

If considering a “double mask,” ensure breathing is not difficult and vision is not obstructed. Do not combine two medical procedure masks or combine a KN95 mask with any other mask. If trying a new mask combination, consider testing at home first.

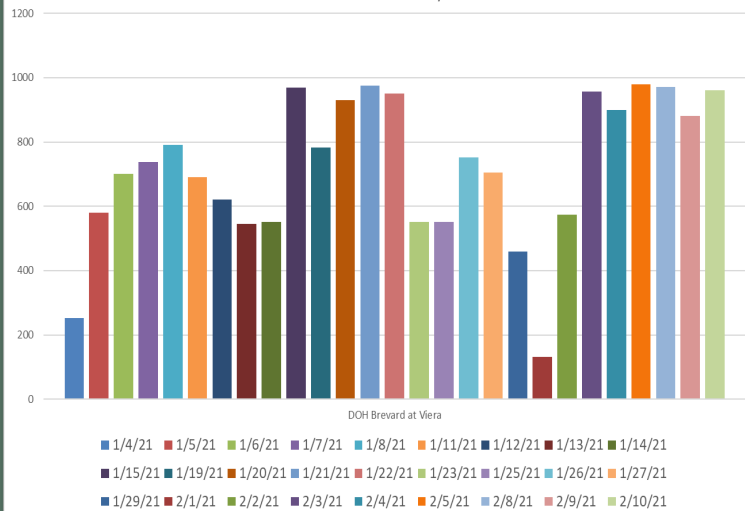

Vaccine Operation Highlights

- Department of Health-Brevard and the partners they are supporting have provided **18,867** vaccines since January 4, 2021
- On January 29, the State of Florida rolled out a statewide COVID-19 Vaccine pre-registration system (phone & internet) for all Florida residents to utilize
 - As of Tuesday, February 9:
 - Statewide pre-registrations: 967,605
 - Brevard County phone pre-registrations: 33,613
- New appointments will be released via the State's pre-registration system going forward as new doses are received
- To pre-register for vaccine appointments and be notified when appointments are available:
 - Go on-line at www.myvaccine.fl.gov
 - Call Brevard's scheduling line: 866-201-5420
 - For individuals who are deaf, deafened, hard of hearing, or who are deafblind a Brevard TTY has been established: 833-476-1525
- Individuals receiving a vaccine are required to bring:
 - [COVID-19 Vaccine Screening and Consent Form](#)
 - Identification form (FL ID, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
 - Individuals with an out-of-state ID should also provide proof of residency or semi-permanent residency (examples: utility bill, property tax receipt, lease agreement for Florida property, etc.)
- On Thursday, February 4, Johnson & Johnson submitted an Emergency Use Authorization application the FDA
 - When approved, initial supply is expected to be limited until production increases

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR COVID-19 VACCINE APPOINTMENT

FIRST DOSE

- Form of ID (driver's license, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
- **Consent Form**
- Proof of Florida Residency
- Appointment confirmation (digital or printed, when applicable)

SECOND DOSE

- Form of ID (driver's license, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
- **Consent Form**
- Proof of Florida Residency
- Vaccine card given to you during your first dose appointment

Brevard County Updates

- [Brevard County Government has a limited amount of funds to assist families who have lost a loved one due to Coronavirus.](#)
- The application for the program is available at the Community Action Agency (Dr. Joe Lee Smith Community Center, 415 Stone Street, Cocoa, FL 32922), or [Brevard County's Housing and Human Services website](#)
- Eligibility requirements include:
 - Cause of death on the death certificate must be directly or indirectly related to Coronavirus (COVID-19)
 - Example of indirect – heart attack (main) exacerbated by coronavirus
 - Brevard resident
 - Household income below 150% of poverty (\$39,300 for a family of 4)

- Effective January 26, [all air passengers arriving to the US from a foreign country are required to get tested](#) no more than 3 days before their flight departs and to present the negative result or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 to the airline before boarding
- The CDC issued [an order requiring the wearing of facemasks while on public transportation conveyances and at transportation hubs](#) effective February 2, 2021
- [The CDC recommends that all people avoid travel on cruise ship, including river cruises, worldwide.](#) Passengers who decide to go on a cruise should get tested 3-5 days after your trip AND stay home for 7 days after travel, including those with negative test results
