#### **Choosing Safer Activities**

- If you are fully vaccinated you can start doing many things that you had stopped doing because of the pandemic, like exercise outdoors with members of your household without masks; or attend small, outdoor gatherings with other fully vaccinated people without masks.
- When choosing safer activities, consider how COVID-19 is spreading in your community, the number of people participating in the activity, and the location of the activity.
- Outdoor visits and activities are safer than indoor activities, and fully vaccinated people can participate in some indoor events safely, without much risk.
- If you haven't been vaccinated yet, <u>find a vaccine</u>.
- According to the Director of the CDC: "When fully vaccinated against COVID-19, you can begin to enjoy many activities more safely. Most outdoor activities for vaccinated people are safe if unmasked. The more people who are vaccinated, the more steps we can take toward spending time with those we love, doing things we enjoy."

## Florida COVID -19 Vaccine Priorities


(Revised 3/26, effective 4/5 per Executive Order 21-79)

## Persons over 18 years of age

\*All vaccines are approved for this age group

## Persons 16 – 17 years of age

\*Requires parental or legal guardian consent
\*Pfizer is the only FDA vaccine approved for this age group



## **Vaccine Operation Highlights**

- Florida Department of Health in Brevard, and the partners they support, have provided 98,018 vaccines since January 4, 2021
- Per the Florida Department of Health, the total number of residents vaccinated in Brevard County is 238,741
  - 76,917 have received at least one dose
    - 74 % of over the age of 65
    - 62 % of over the age of 50
    - 46 % of over the age of 16
  - 123,724 have completed the full series
- BCFR's vaccine outreach program Operation Homebound continues to operate with 2 dedicated crews to the mission
  - Total vaccinated (as of 4/27): 868
    - 1st dose: 570
    - 2nd dose: 328
- Emergency Management is partnering with Library Services to host one of the State's Mobile Vaccine Vans at Eau Gallie Library for the surrounding community on a walk-up basis
  - Thursday, April 29 from 11:00 AM 5:00 PM
  - · No appointments necessary
  - Up to 400 doses of Johnson and Johnson are available
- Emergency Management is partnering with the City of Cocoa and Brevard County Parks and Recreation to host one of the State's Mobile Vaccine Vans at Provost Park for the surrounding community on a walk-up basis
  - Saturday, May 1 from 10:00 AM 6:00 PM
  - · No appointments necessary
  - Up to 400 doses of Johnson and Johnson are available
- On April 22 and April 24 Brevard County hosted one of the State's Mobile COVID-19 Vaccine vans at Isaac Campbell Community Center and Lipscomb Park respectively
- The Florida Division of Emergency Management has launched a contact email for homebound seniors to register for the COVID-19 vaccine to be brought directly to them

- Rapid antigen tests with results in as soon as 15 minutes now available
- Insurance information will be requested but is not required to receive a test
  - There will be no copay or any fee charged
- Identification is no longer required but does expedite the process









## **Brevard County Updates**



- Brevard County Government has a limited amount of funds to assist families who have lost a loved one due to Coronavirus. The
   <u>application for the program</u> is available at the Community Action Agency (Dr. Joe Lee Smith Community Center, 415 Stone Street, Cocoa, FL
   32922), or Brevard County's Housing and Human Services website.
  - Eligibility requirements include:
    - Cause of death on the death certificate must be directly or indirectly related to Coronavirus (COVID-19)
      - Example of indirect heart attack (main) exacerbated by coronavirus
    - Brevard resident and household income below 150% of poverty (\$39,300 for a family of 4)
- The Emergency Rental Assistance Program provides financial assistance and housing stability services for those impacted by COVID-19.
  - Eligibility requirements include:
    - Applicant is a resident of Brevard County and is below 80% of Area Median Income.
    - The applicant must sign all required documents or their application will be rejected/denied.
    - Documentation of all income from the entire Household as reported on the Household Income Section of the application (include 2 months of bank statements, paystubs, etc., or a 2020 tax return (IRS Form 1040)).
    - All members of a household must be accounted for in the application.
    - For applications filled out by hand, please make sure that the writing is clear and legible.

#### **State and National Updates**

- On Tuesday, April 27 Governor DeSantis signed <u>Executive Order 21-94</u>, extending Florida' State of Emergency for COVID-19 response to June 26, 2021
- On Friday, April 23, following a thorough safety review by the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, it was the CDC have the recommended Johnson & Johnson vaccine pause be lifted and use of the vaccine should resume, Per the advisory committee:
  - Determined that the available data show that the vaccine's known and potential benefits outweigh its known and potential risks in individuals 18 years of age and older
  - Will add a warning label to note the potential risk for rare blood clots, especially in women ages 18-49
- On Tuesday, April 27 the CDC updated its recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People:
  - No longer need to wear a mask outdoors, except in crowded settings and venues
  - Workers no longer need to be restricted from work following an exposure as long as they are asymptomatic
  - Residents of non-healthcare congregate settings no longer need to quarantine following a known exposure
  - Asymptomatic individuals without an exposure may be exempted from routine screening testing, if feasible
- Per the CDC, as of April 28<sup>th</sup>, more than 235 million doses of vaccines have been administered in the United States and 43% of the entire United States population over the age of 18 has had at least one dose of a COVID vaccine.
