Persons over 18 years of age

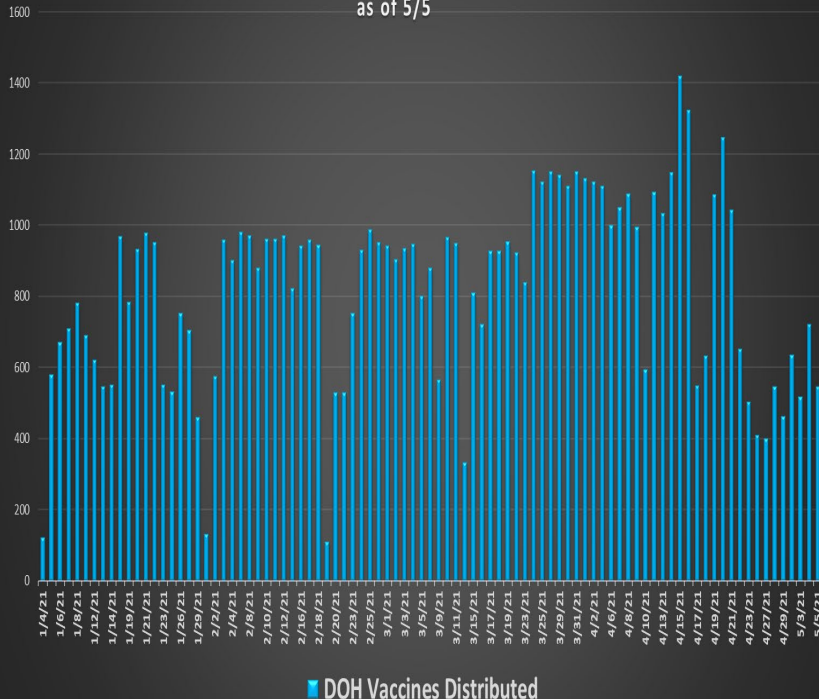
*All vaccines are approved for this age group

Persons 16 – 17 years of age

*Requires parental or legal guardian consent

*Pfizer is the only FDA vaccine approved for this age group

Vaccine Operation Highlights

- Florida Department of Health -Brevard, and the partners they support, have provided 103,154 vaccines since January 4, 2021
- Per the Florida Department of Health, the total number of residents vaccinated in Brevard County is 247,523
 - 70,073 have received at least one dose
 - 48% of those 16 plus
 - 64% of those 50 plus
 - 75% of those 65 plus
 - 177,450 have completed the full series
- BCFR's vaccine outreach program Operation Homebound continues to operate with 2 dedicated crews to the mission
 - Total vaccinated (as of 5/4): 939
 - 1st dose: 602
 - 2nd dose: 337
- The Florida Department of Health-Brevard conducted a vaccine outreach events at the Florida Eastern Florida State College and Florida Institute of Technology
- Emergency Management coordinated with Library Services, and the State to host a Mobile Vaccine Van to the Eau Gallie Library on Thursday, April 29th and Provost Park in Cocoa on Saturday, May 1st
- The Florida Division of Emergency Management has launched a contact email for homebound seniors to register for the COVID-19 vaccine to be brought directly to them

- Drive-through, no appointment required
 - Monday – Sunday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM
 - 250 Community College Parkway (Use the entrance from San Filippo Dr. SE & Jupiter Blvd.)
 - Testing available for adults and children of all ages
 - Rapid antigen tests with results in as soon as 15 minutes now available
 - Insurance information will be requested but is not required to receive a test
 - There will be no copay or any fee charged
 - Identification is no longer required but does expedite the process

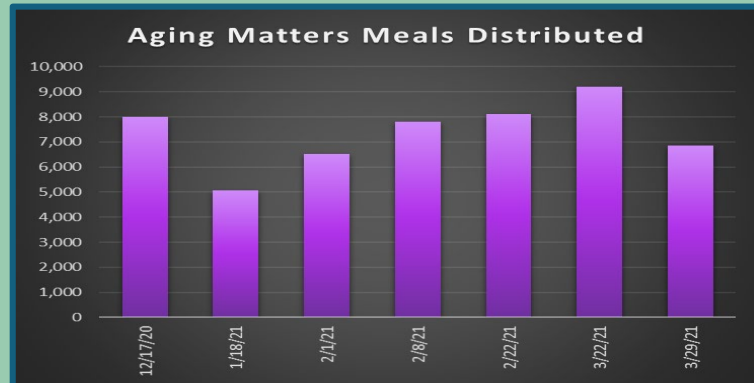
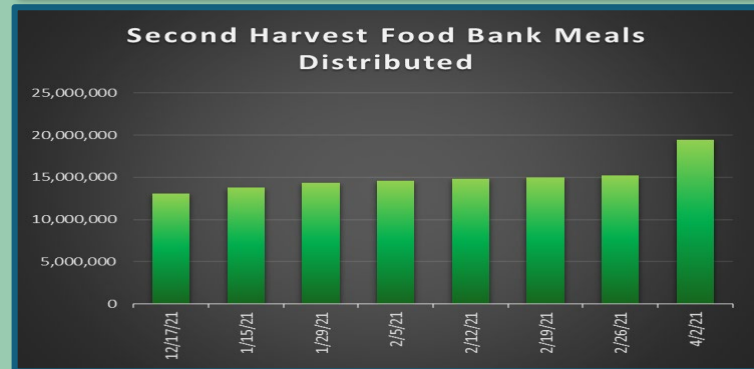
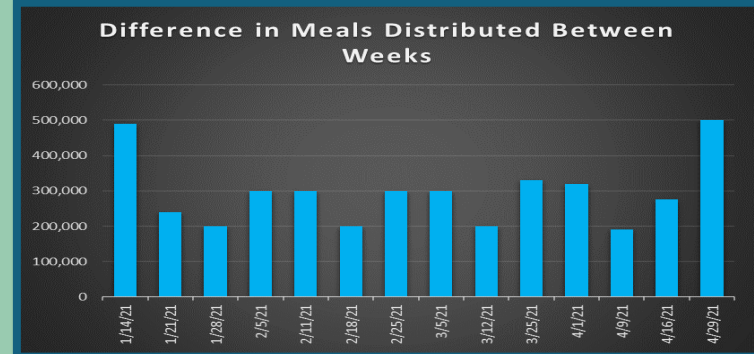

Brevard County Updates



- Brevard County Government has a limited amount of funds to assist families who have lost a loved one due to Coronavirus. The [application for the program](#) is available at the Community Action Agency (Dr. Joe Lee Smith Community Center, 415 Stone Street, Cocoa, FL 32922), or [Brevard County's Housing and Human Services website](#).
 - Eligibility requirements include:
 - Cause of death on the death certificate must be directly or indirectly related to Coronavirus (COVID-19)
 - Example of indirect – heart attack (main) exacerbated by coronavirus
 - Brevard resident and household income below 150% of poverty (\$39,300 for a family of 4)
 - The [Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) provides financial assistance and housing stability services for those impacted by COVID-19.
 - Eligibility requirements include:
 - Applicant is a resident of Brevard County and is below 80% of Area Median Income.
 - The applicant must sign all required documents or their application will be rejected/denied.
 - Documentation of all income from the entire Household as reported on the Household Income Section of the application (include 2 months of bank statements, paystubs, etc., or a 2020 tax return (IRS Form 1040)).
 - All members of a household must be accounted for in the application.
 - For applications filled out by hand, please make sure that the writing is clear and legible

State and National Updates

- On May 3, Governor Desantis signed [Executive Order 21-102](#), immediately suspending COVID-19 restrictions issued by local authorities
- On April 29, Florida's Surgeon General Dr. Rivkees issued a [Public Health Advisory](#) rescinding previous advisories, expanding vaccine eligibility to include non-Florida residents providing goods and services in Florida, and encouraging the resumption of in-person government operations and services
- On May 5, the CDC issued new [technical instructions](#) for conducting simulated passenger voyages. This will assess the cruise ship operator's ability to reduce the risk of Covid-19 on cruise ship, including COVID-19 safety protocols, Management of ill passengers and crew and transportation of individuals with COVID-19 or possible exposure.
- The CDC has updated it's recommendations for [Fully Vaccinated People](#):
 - No longer need to wear a mask outdoors, except in crowded settings and venues
 - Employees no longer need to be restricted from work following an exposure as long as they are asymptomatic
 - Residents of non-healthcare congregate settings no longer need to quarantine following a known exposure
 - Asymptomatic individuals without an exposure may be exempted from routine screening testing, if feasible
- Per the CDC, as of May 5, more than [250 million doses of vaccines](#) have been administered in the United States and 44.7 % of the entire United States population over the age of 18 has had at least one dose of a COVID vaccine
