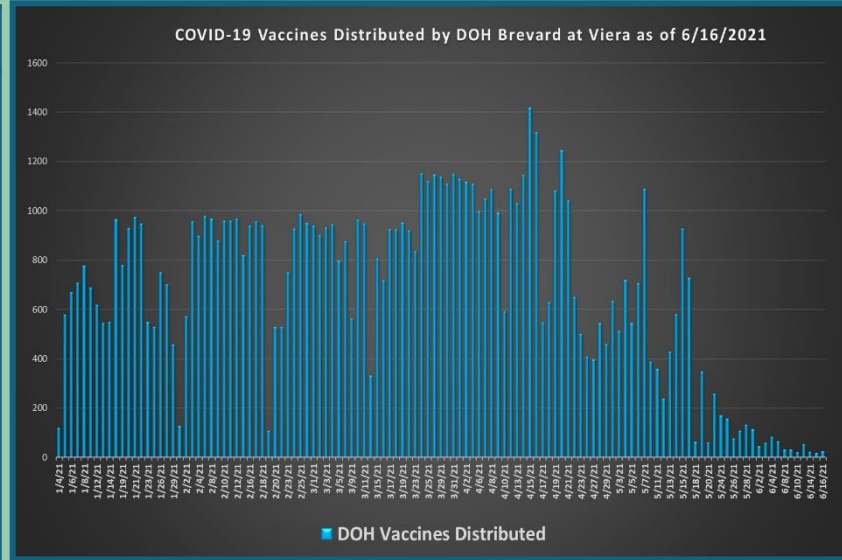

Vaccine Operation Highlights

- Florida Department of Health - Brevard, and the partners they support, have provided 114,466 vaccines since January 4, 2021
- The Florida Department of Health has made adjustments to the COVID-19 [dashboard](#) and switched to weekly reports
- Per the Florida Department of Health, the total number of residents vaccinated in Brevard County is 285,656 (as of 6/10)
 - 53% of those 12 plus
- DOH has partnered with Library Services, Emergency Management and Health Heroes to conduct a Pfizer vaccine operation with an emphasis on increasing vaccine availability for children 12-17, but is open to anyone 12+ **(dates/location on page 2)**
- DOH is coordinating with the local business community to establish vaccine outreach missions

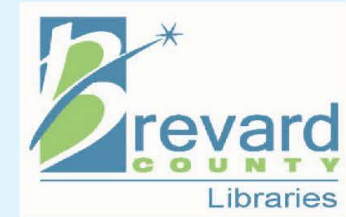

Brevard County Updates



- Brevard County Government has a limited amount of funds to assist families who have lost a loved one due to Coronavirus. The [application for the program](#) is available at the Community Action Agency (Dr. Joe Lee Smith Community Center, 415 Stone Street, Cocoa, FL 32922), or [Brevard County's Housing and Human Services website](#).
 - Eligibility requirements include:
 - Cause of death on the death certificate must be directly or indirectly related to Coronavirus (COVID-19)
 - Example of indirect – heart attack (main) exacerbated by coronavirus
 - Brevard resident and household income below 150% of poverty (\$39,300 for a family of 4)
 - The [Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) provides financial assistance and housing stability services for those impacted by COVID-19.
 - Eligibility requirements include:
 - Applicant is a resident of Brevard County and is below 80% of Area Median Income.
 - The applicant must sign all required documents or their application will be rejected/denied.
 - Documentation of all income from the entire Household as reported on the Household Income Section of the application (include 2 months of bank statements, paystubs, etc., or a 2020 tax return (IRS Form 1040)).
 - All members of a household must be accounted for in the application.
 - For applications filled out by hand, please make sure that the writing is clear and legible
 - Program statistics as of 5/21/21:
 - 848 applications received since 2/12/21
 - 601 (71%) from municipalities
 - 245 (29%) from County (unincorporated)

State and National Updates

- All state COVID-19 testing sites have transition to local providers, such as primary care offices, retail, and pharmacies

- Per the CDC, as of June 16, [more than 312 million doses of vaccines](#) have been administered in the United States and 61.7% of the entire United States population over 12 has had at least one dose of a COVID vaccine
- CDC is hosting on June 21st a zoom call on: [A Call To Action: Mobilizing America to Vaccinate Against COVID-19](#)
- The current 7-day moving average of [daily new cases \(13,997\) decreased 6.0%](#) compared with the previous 7-day moving average (14,890). Compared with the highest peak on January 10, 2021 (251,834), [the current 7-day average decreased 94.4%](#).
- The White House announced that the United States is donating half a billion vaccines to countries around the world because it's the right thing to do – and because as long as this virus has a hold somewhere in the world, we're all at risk.
- The CDC issued [guidance for fully vaccinated individuals](#) within the United States. Per the guidance, they can now resume activities that were done prior to the pandemic without wearing a mask or social distancing; except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, workplace guidance, rules, and regulations
