Malabar Referendum Questions

On November 8, 2022, millions of Americans will head to the polls to place their votes in the upcoming election. For the Town of Malabar, there will be two items on the ballot. The first is a decision on whether to continue with the Brevard County Law Enforcement Municipal Services Taxing Unit (MSTU). Every two years Malabar residents vote to decide if the Town continues to receive additional law enforcement services from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office. In 2020, the MSTU Referendum passed Town wide with 87.71% in support. This year, according to Ordinance 2022-05, passed on May 16, 2022 with a 4-0 vote of Council, the ballot question will appear as follows:

Question 1. Continued Participation in the Brevard County Law Enforcement MSTU

Instruction to voters: If you are in favor of the continuing of the MSTU with the Brevard County Law Enforcement Patrol Services, mark the space to the left of the word "YES". If you are not in favor of continuing with Brevard County for Law Enforcement Patrol Services, mark the space to the left of the word "NO".

The other question on the ballot this year is a non-binding referendum on increasing the millage rate from 4.50001 to 5.0000. The Town Council has identified a key need in the Town to maintain and upgrade the Town roads, such as Corey Road, Weber Road, Rocky Point Road, Briar Creek Blvd, Country Cove Circle, Hall Road, and Atz Road. This year, according to Resolution 16-2022, passed on August 15th 2022 by unanimous decision, the ballot question will appear as follows:

Question 1. Would you support a millage rate of 5.0000 the fiscal Year 2023/2024 to fund capital improvements and operations? The Town Council proposes a millage rate of 5.0000 mills for fiscal year 2023/2024. The cost breakdown for a house with a taxable value of \$85,000.00 if the millage rate is 5.0000 mills for 2023/2024 would be 425.00 in fiscal year 2023/2024
