Malabar SpringFest Celebration

Malabar is proud to be hosting our annual SpringFest this month, on March 20th. The event will be held at Malabar Community Park, located at 1850 Malabar Road. The event will run from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. Dolphin Auto will be presenting a car show. Awards will be given out for eleven (11) different classes. Pre-registration for the Car Show is \$15, and day of registration is \$20. Last year's Car Show had over 100 cars, and all participants enjoyed the great display of vehicles. Malabar Fire Rescue Department will give a demonstration of the vehicle extraction tools commonly known as the Jaws of Life. Interim Town Manager Lisa Morrell has generously agreed to match whatever profits are raised for this fine endeavor.

Food for SpringFest will be provided by local vendors. Long time area resident Ruth Vail will be selling Sno Cones from her Sno Tiki food truck. Malabar resident Kelly Hare will be on site displaying and selling her homemade cupcakes from her company Sunshine Cupcakes. Also in attendance will be Mr. Hall, an Orlando area resident, who is bringing his Lobster and Steak food truck just for this event!
